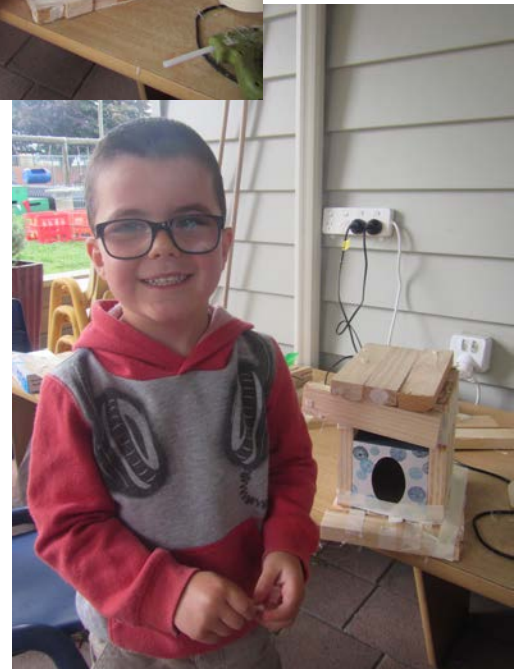
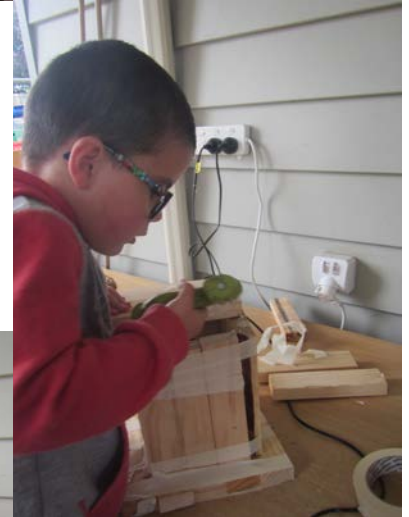


# Birdhouse connections
