


1. Effective Leadership in ECE

2. Assessment, Planning & Evaluation

By focusing on strengths, learning dispositions & working theories, this process, focused on Learning Stories enables all to truly see the children in our care, deepen our relationships with whānau, and intentionally design environments that promote learning and care.

- Lead coherent assessment, planning, and evaluation
- Use documentation to inform teaching
- Support staff and embed culturally responsive practice
- Evaluate impact on children's learning



Limited to 10 Services

- Teams from each service to engage in a robust Assessment, Planning and Evaluation process

3. Embodied Mātauranga

This programme aims to support kaiako to connect with Māori concepts in applied ways that are grounded in their specific learning environments.

Examples could include:

- A framework based on the elements of te taiao (earth, water, air etc).
- A deeper look at the taiao connections of te Kāhui Matariki.
- Unique entry point emerging from the kaiako, learning environment or learning community.



Limited to 5 Services

Teams will extend their learning around Māori concepts, applied in ways that are grounded in their specific learning environments.

4. Supporting Unqualified Kaiako with Te Whāriki

Support for Unqualified Kaiako, those new to Aotearoa New Zealand, or those who are just requiring a refresher. Providing opportunities to engage with Te Whāriki 2017 to ensure that teachers' have a strengthened understanding of the principles and strands.

- Understand the principles, strands, and goals of Te Whāriki
- Recognise how Te Whāriki guides teaching and learning
- Support planning and assessment under supervision
- Build confidence in daily teaching practice
